# GUIDE TO DISCIPLESHIP

This material will give you instructions to help you share with others what you have learned from this series.

## SOME BASIC GUIDELINES

1. Plan a weekly appointment with your disciple(s) — remembering to be as consistent as possible.
2. This 6-CD series can be used on a one-on-one basis, giving a copy of the CD and questionnaire to a disciple on a weekly basis and establishing an appointment time to meet for prayer/discussion/encouragement. You may want to follow the weekly appointment guide to establish a format.
3. This 6-CD series can also be used in a small group, using the weekly appointment guide as a means for someone to oversee and promote group discussion in possibly a home or church setting.
4. Always prepare your heart with prayer, and familiarize yourself with the material before your weekly appointment time.
5. Be patient and sensitive to spiritual needs and do not push beyond a person's capabilities. Some will move faster than others.
6. When meeting with your disciple, as often as possible get them to repeat back to you what you have gone over to make sure they understand it.
7. Discipleship is learning to become a disciplined one, so do not give materials/CD to the next lesson until they complete the one they have been given.
8. Compliment work done by the disciple(s) and encourage each one at every opportunity.
9. If you feel, after the first 6-CD series, that your disciple is ready for the next 6-CD series, discuss this with them and pray with them to make a renewed commitment.
10. You may want to share your series with another disciple or encourage them to purchase one of their own.

## **PRIOR TO APPOINTMENT 1**

1. Give a copy of appropriate CD and lesson to your disciple(s) and encourage completion of the questionnaire after listening to the CD. Encourage them to take notes, as people forget 90% of what they hear within the first 72 hours.
2. Set up a time within a week where you may be able to meet, for about an hour to an hour and a half, with as little distraction as possible, whether it be in a home, office or church setting.
3. Familiarize yourself with the CD and questionnaire before your meeting. Pray for the time you will spend together.

## **APPOINTMENT 1**

1. Get acquainted with your disciple(s) and ask them to share with you how they came to know Christ.
2. Begin discussing the questionnaire by going over the answers with them, particularly paying attention to see if they understand or have any questions.
3. Be especially alert to making sure your disciple has an assurance of their salvation. This is of primary importance. Refer to Question 11; also be sure they understand they are a 3-part being and that their soul is made up of their mind, will and emotions which is still in a saving process.
4. Give your disciple(s), only if they have completed Lesson 1, the next CD and questionnaire for your next appointment. Close with prayer.

3. Familiarize yourself with the CD and questionnaire before your meeting. Pray for the time you will spend together.

**How to Memorize So that You Don't Forget a Verse:**

After you have selected a verse, read it in the Bible context; it helps you understand the verse.

Read the verse thoughtfully several times aloud. Then begin learning the verse in this order: say the topic, then verse reference, then the first phrase of the verse. Stop at the first punctuation mark if you like; repeat the verse reference again. Then start over: topic, reference, phrase, reference. Always beginning at the first, add a few more words, ending with the reference, "bit by bit" till you have the whole verse learned. Then REVIEW, REVIEW, AND REVIEW.

# GUIDE TO DISCIPLESHIP

This material will give you instructions to help you share with others what you have learned from this series.

## SOME BASIC GUIDELINES

1. Plan a weekly appointment with your disciple(s) — remembering to be as consistent as possible.
2. This 6-CD series can be used on a one-on-one basis, giving a copy of the CD and questionnaire to a disciple on a weekly basis and establishing an appointment time to meet for prayer/discussion/encouragement. You may want to follow the weekly appointment guide to establish a format.
3. This 6-CD series can also be used in a small group, using the weekly appointment guide as a means for someone to oversee and promote group discussion in possibly a home or church setting.
4. Always prepare your heart with prayer, and familiarize yourself with the material before your weekly appointment time.
5. Be patient and sensitive to spiritual needs and do not push beyond a person's capabilities. Some will move faster than others.
6. When meeting with your disciple, as often as possible get them to repeat back to you what you have gone over to make sure they understand it.
7. Discipleship is learning to become a disciplined one, so do not give materials/CD to the next lesson until they complete the one they have been given.
8. Compliment work done by the disciple(s) and encourage each one at every opportunity.
9. If you feel, after the second 6-CD series, that your disciple is ready for the next 6-CD series—Building Disciples Series 3—discuss this with them and pray with them to make a renewed commitment.
10. You may want to share your series with another disciple or encourage them to purchase one of their own.

## **PRIOR TO APPOINTMENT 7**

1. Give a copy of appropriate CD and lesson to your disciple(s) and encourage completion of the questionnaire after listening to the CD. Encourage them to take notes, as people forget 90% of what they hear within the first 72 hours.
2. Set up a time within a week where you may be able to meet, for about an hour to an hour and a half, with as little distraction as possible, whether it be in a home, office or church setting.
3. Familiarize yourself with the CD and questionnaire before your meeting. Pray for the time you will spend together.

2. Set up a time within a week where you may be able to meet, for about an hour to an hour and a half, with as little distraction as possible, whether it be in a home, office or church setting.
3. Familiarize yourself with the CD and questionnaire before your meeting. Pray for the time you will spend together.

## **APPOINTMENT 11**

1. Open your meeting time with prayer. Share your desire to help your disciple to grow so that they too may be able to help someone and meet with them like you are doing, to encourage. Share with them the principle of discipleship again (Matthew 28:19-20).
2. Review questionnaire with your disciple(s) and go over their answers. Do they have a clear understanding of the power of their words, especially in relation to their spiritual walk?
3. Have your disciple(s) think of some areas in which their confession of words may need to be changed, if truly death and life are in the power of the tongue. Help encourage them to be aware of the potential of negative thoughts meditated upon, which will produce negative words; and in contrast, how positive thoughts from the word of God can produce positive words.
4. Have them write out a confession using the word of God, to be reviewed next lesson:

SAMPLES: I fear not, for God has not given me a spirit of fear but of power, love and a sound mind (II Timothy 1:7, Romans 8:31).

The Lord is my shepherd, I do not want. My God supplies all my need according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus (Psalm 23, Philippians 4:19).

Give your disciple Lesson #12 with CD only if they have completed Lesson #11. Close with prayer.

## GUIDE TO DISCIPLESHIP

This material will give you instructions to help you share with others what you have learned from this series.

### SOME BASIC GUIDELINES

1. Plan a weekly appointment with your disciple(s) — remembering to be as consistent as possible.
2. This 6-CD series can be used on a one-on-one basis, giving a copy of the CD and questionnaire to a disciple on a weekly basis and establishing an appointment time to meet for prayer/discussion/encouragement. You may want to follow the weekly appointment guide to establish a format.
3. This 6-CD series can also be used in a small group, using the weekly appointment guide as a means for someone to oversee and promote group discussion in possibly a home or church setting.
4. Always prepare your heart with prayer, and familiarize yourself with the material before your weekly appointment time.
